 - A. Concerns: refs checking player cards (kids coming late & questioning their age), getting teams in correct divisions (playing their own skill level)
 - B. Want to know if kids are registered with CASL
 - C. MUST check players in for the insurance to kick in
 - D. Can't solve referee problems until we get enough referees
 - E. Can't print match cards until a day or so before the game
 - F. Be careful what you do at the field–high school kid as referee needs to be handled carefully–ask if the kid was checked in, get that done & take a picture to double check with the CASL office if needed
 - G. Everyone needs to have player cards, laminated & ready to go
 - H. The role of the referee is not to decide if a person should play; it is a duty of CASL to be sure the right kids are playing there
 - I. We as a league have to take some responsibility since the director or complaints director didn't get back to them.
 - J. Time to raise the fees by \$5 or \$10
 - K. If we bump up the fees, can we increase the financial aid a bit also?
 - L. The new GotSport is a huge improvement over the old system from a community perspective—we could do our own people
 - M. GotSport keeps the community rep in the loop–it allows them to see potential problems
